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## How to Safely Carry a Dog

During the bitter cold weather a couple of weeks ago, I had to pick Henson up and carry him back to the house. We'd gone into the back yard, where there was still quite a bit of snow on the ground, and in under 10 minutes, he indicated he couldn't walk any further. That was a shock, considering the short time we were out. It was difficult to pick him up, as we were both all bundled up, the wind was whipping the snow around, and it was pitch dark. Coincidentally, Sherry forwarded an article for *Teeter Tales* on the proper way to pick up dogs. So here's the scoop:

The best way to lift a small dog without hurting its back or yours is to kneel or stoop so that you are facing the broad side of the dog. Reach the arm nearest the dog's rear end around the outside of its body and tuck that hand between the dog's front legs to support its chest. Your arm should be resting parallel to the outside of the dog's body, and the dog's rear legs should be resting between your arm and your body. Gently scoop the dog up by moving your elbow toward your body, with that arm supporting the dog's rear legs. With



your other hand, hold the outside of the dog's body from the other direction and pull it toward you as you stand, to keep the dog from falling, squirming, or jumping out of your arms. Keeping the dog's rear legs supported by your arm, rather than letting them dangle, will help keep its spine straight, which is more comfortable and less stressful. Tricky with a long dog!

When lifting a larger or injured dog, it is easier to use a dog bed, blanket, or stretcher, with the help of another person or two. If that's not possible, and you must lift it alone, kneel facing one side of the dog, wrap both arms around its legs, being careful one arm is going around its chest, not covering the throat, and carry it in such a way that the front legs are not being forced backward and the back legs are being supported by an arm. If the dog will be carried only a short way, putting one arm under the abdomen in front of the rear legs might be less awkward, but leaving the rear legs dangling for long puts stress on the dog's spine.

### President's Report (Konnie McCaffree):

- The October 10, 2017, member meeting minutes were unanimously approved. It was noted that Kim Sector's name was not included in the September meeting minutes as a member of the Nominating Committee.
- Next member meeting date and time: Monday, December 4, 2017, 8:15pm, at the Firehouse. The following membership meeting will be Saturday, February 24, 2018, at the banquet.
- Next workday: Friday, December 8, 2017, from 5 – 8pm to prepare for the ACT and bring all equipment in from the outside for the winter.
- Training Director and Scheduler Positions: Konnie McCaffree has agreed to be the temporary leader of Training; Dina Melendez will continue in her role as Scheduler. Konnie's responsibilities will include visiting classes to speak with instructors. Postmeeting update per Konnie's discussion with Dina: Dina wants to meet with the trainers to establish criteria for teams to move up. Both Konnie and Dina will communicate with any new instructor candidates and coordinate seminars. Both may respond to inquiries from prospective new students, etc. The Scheduler will work with current instructors and students regarding class scheduling needs.

### Committee Reports

**Training Director Update (Dina Melendez):** No update, not present.

### ACT (Tony Luzynski):

- Plans for the December 9, 2017 ACT event: Tony has 3 volunteers for the event. He will not be organizing these events in 2018, but is willing to be the evaluator. Betty Skilton and Patty Mortara agreed to be the organizers in 2018. Action: Teresa to prepare "Save the Date" flyer for UKI March 2018 trial to be distributed at the December ACT, emphasizing "Not for Competition" (NFC) runs.

### • AKC Trials (April 28–29, 2018, and August 11–12, 2018.

Updates from Konnie and Tony due to absence of trial chairs):

— **April Trial:** Tony has drafted a letter for Konnie to send to the club within 100 miles of the Kruisin' facility to request permission to hold the April trial. This is needed since the request made by Kruisin' to this club in 2017 only referred to the 2017 trial. Action: Konnie to send letter.

— **August Trial:** The August trial site approval request (scoped for 3 rings) has been sent to the AKC. The following actions regarding the August 2018 trial were noted at the October 10, 2017 meeting:

○ Kim to follow-up on the following three items with the manager: (1) if permission of the township is required for a dog event; (2) if permission from the plaza is necessary to add potty areas at the back of the facility; and (3) obtain the contract.

• **Weekday AKC Trials:** The Board is interested in holding weekday AKC trials in the spring (when the AKC participants are trying to accumulate points for final standings at the AKC Invitationals). Carole Allen has agreed to chair the trials and is researching dates.

### UKI Trials Chair (Teresa Koziatek):

- 168 runs, \$1425 check from Paul Mount.
- Next trial: Saturday, March 3, 2018. Judy Kolva is judge.

### Nose-/Scentwork Coordinators (Carole Allen/Peg Antrobus):

AKC Trials: The Board is interested in holding AKC trials. No action was taken.

*Note from October 10, 2017, meeting: Carole Allen provided an update at the member meeting. She discussed seminars with Stacy Barnett and the fee would be \$800 - \$900 per day. Carole also reported that Horseshoe Bend Park in Frenchtown, NJ, looks very good, has concrete floor and its clean and heated. The rent is \$175 per day, and from November 15-March 15, an additional fee of \$50 for heat is required. There is also a \$300 deposit for cleanup fee. Carole proposed that the club could do seminars and ORT at the facility.*

Action: Konnie to discuss next steps on both of these with Carole.

### Banquet (Linda Goldman):

- The Board approved the date of Saturday, February 24, 2018, at the Gardenville Inn. We need a minimum of 40 attendees to get the best price.
- Volunteers: Alan is doing the video; Terri is doing the certificates and will coordinate with Alan regarding instructor gift certificates, and with Dina regarding the instructor names; Linda is doing the games; Konnie will coordinate any additional awards and gifts. Action: Members are requested to send new titles in 2017 to Terri via email.

**Membership Report (Peg Antrobus):** Peg has sent applications to two new people, but has not received replies.

**Library Report (Becky Forry):** No update at the meeting.

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**Website Report (Allison Miele):** No update at the meeting.

**New Business:**

- The Board expressed its appreciation to the Nominating Committee (Linda Goldman [chair], Cindy Everett, and Kim Sector). The following slate of candidates for next year's officers and Board will be voted on at the December meeting:  
President- Sherry Wilson  
Vice President - Konnie McCaffree  
Treasurer- Betty Skilton  
Secretary - Terri Natishan  
Board (2nd year of term): Diane Carney, Joanna Fleming, Linda Goldman (one year replacing Terri)  
Board (1st year of term): Anne Ford, Sally Hunter (updated subsequent to meeting)
  - Membership Meetings for 2018: Konnie polled the members present at the meeting to determine if they would like to continue monthly meetings or have fewer meetings. The general consensus was to have quarterly meetings on the same date (example: first Wednesday) each month with a membership requirement to attend one meeting annually. Action: Konnie and Teresa to poll the full membership via SurveyMonkey.
  - The members discussed having more notice of meetings, class registration dates, etc. Action: Konnie will discuss posting on the website calendar and address sending advance email notices.
  - Manners, Puppy Classes, Renting the barn to outside instructors:
    - The members discussed having Manners (with a CGC test at the end) and Puppy Classes at the barn, targeting the weekend.
    - Jeanie Burton knows some people who might be interested in teaching.
    - We considered allowing outside instructors to teach the classes, providing they pay a rental fee to Kruisin. Action: Konnie to get names of people from Jeanie.
- Old Business (some topics pending Board decisions):**
- Updating the new member procedure to remove need for vot-

ing/readings, etc: The Board reviewed the initial draft of language prepared by Teresa. Action: Teresa to update draft language and send to Board for review, with the goal of presenting the draft to the membership 2 weeks prior to the December meeting as required for a change in Bylaws.

- New lease: No price increases or changes in terms and conditions for the next 5 years. Konnie as President will sign the contract.
- Firehouse rental for next year: No price increase (\$25/meeting). Contract will depend on the number of meetings agreed by the membership for next year.
- Brochure Marketing/Distribution: not discussed. Action: Add to agenda for December membership meeting.
- Response to individual in Utah requesting to use "Kruisin K-9s" name for a pet sitting business: Konnie sent an email in response to the individual that we would prefer she change the spelling of "Kruisin" to "Cruisin" or "Cruising" and then use "K-9s" (Not "Kanines").
- Pigeon problem: Konnie and Alan are researching.
- Electric heaters for Nosework class areas: No decision made. Action: Add to agenda for December Board meeting.

**Business on Hold:**

- Outdoor ring: on hold until the lease is negotiated and signed.
- Membership chair additional responsibilities (or new mentoring committee) to provide the following to new members:
  - Information on Policies and Procedures from the website
  - Meeting attendance requirements
  - Workday requirements
  - Barn use forms, combination, library, Barn and equipment usage guidelines.

- Approval of the November 2, 2017, Member Meeting minutes: The club approved the meeting minutes.
- Schedule for subsequent meetings: Voters' choice – see summary under New Business.
- Schedule for upcoming workday: December 8.
  - Work day is prior to ACT event on December 9.
  - Sherry will be present at workday.
  - Sign-up sheet created by Allison Miele and will be used.
  - Workers requested to bring in equipment from outside inside.

● Cash flow will be down by \$8000 for 1/1/2017 to 12/31/2017 compared to last year due to reduced trial revenue. Upsides in 2018 could be the August trial, one-day weekly trials, small increases in training fees, adding puppies/manners classes, and conducting other Saturday activities at the barn for people not doing agility trials.

- Training fees and class fees procedures:
  - The board approved the increases in class "additional training" and drop-in fees for members and nonmembers.
  - There will be small increases in class "additional training" and drop-in fees for members and non-members. Changes are being made to provide incentive for signing up for classes.
  - The proposed increases for class "additional training" fees are from \$105 to \$120 (member) and from \$140 to \$160 (nonmember).
  - The proposed increase in drop-in fee for members is

from \$15 to \$25 and nonmembers from \$20 to \$30. This is in line with Y2 and Princeton rates.

- Limited Lesson Member: Board approved elimination of the Limited Lesson member policy which gave nonmembers a break in drop-in fees.
- Barn Use Fees - Provision in Bylaws: If an active member does not attend any classes, and wants to be eligible to reserve the barn, Barn Use Fees are paid. The current policy to use the barn for the full six months is that \$50 is subtracted from the amount on the Training Fee bill which is the amount the member pays. It was proposed to change the \$50 to \$100 subtracted from the Training Fee bill. The club discussed, voted, and agreed with the change in the bylaws. Action item: Sherry to make this change more widely known to the club members.

#### Interim Training Report (Konnie McCaffree):

- New Scheduling Director and Training Director will be announced at a later date.

#### Committee Reports

##### AKC Trial April 2018 (Kim Sectar, Chair):

All activities are on track for the trial at the barn.

- Judge: Barbara Bounds
- Trial Secretary: Anna
- Status of waiver from club within 100 miles of Kruisin' – we will need to apply for this every year.

##### AKC Trial August 2018 (Sherry Wilson, Chair):

- Secured new site for the trial at SMG in Warminster, which is air conditioned.
- Two judges identified: Greg Beck and Dan Faulkner
- Trial Secretary: Jeff Abel
- Kim Sectar sent the contract for board review.
- The board approved the contract. Tony will sign the contract on behalf of the club and send in with the deposit by January 1.
- Other updates from Kim Sectar:
  - MADD agility is renting equipment.
  - Permission of the township is not required for a dog event.
  - Permission is not required from the plaza to add potty areas at the back of the facility.

##### Weekday AKC Trials (Spring 2018) (Carole Allen, Chair):

- Potential dates can be considered now since 2018 trial events are being posted online. Action item: Carole to provide a plan with potential dates to the new board in early 2018.

##### ACT (Tony Luzynski):

- Work night is scheduled on December 8 to help prepare for the event.
- 60 runs currently scheduled.

The candidates were unanimously approved by the club members and assumed responsibility for Kruisin' Kanines on December 5, 2017.

Post-meeting notes: Terri documented the election results in a signed, scanned memo and provided to Tony after the meeting. Tony and Betty met with Uninvest Bank and the bank required additional paperwork to be signed by the club officers to complete the transition of treasurer from Tony to Betty.

**Membership Meeting Schedule for 2018**

- o Members suggested having the quarterly meetings prior to trials or other big club events.

**Priority Old Business**

- Marketing/Advertising for the Club, including brochure distribution:
  - Brochures were distributed at the meeting to club members to provide to post at local businesses.

**Old Business**

- Manners and Puppy Classes, including renting the building to outside instructors. Action item: Konnie and Jeanie to provide an update regarding potential instructors at the next meeting.
- Repairs Needed for Back Wall of Ring 2: Alan and Konnie talked with Jack Glass about fixing the wall in Ring 2; the cost is \$475.
- Electric Heaters for Nosework Classes: Electric heaters are being considered for nosework classes. Konnie donated two more electric heaters to add to those already in the club.
- Outdoor Agility Trial Ring – Determine if needed
  - The board decided that the outdoor agility ring was not needed due to cost. It was noted that not many people go to outdoor agility trials and this investment may not be profitable.
- The following topic was not discussed due to time constraints at the meeting: Protecting the “Kruisin Kanines” logo: Do we need a registered trademark?

**Business on Hold**



# Remembering Duke

He was always there for me after school, or after a trip; he waited by the bedroom door until I came up, and only then would he hop in his bed. He often gave kisses, licking my hand after a treat or for nothing at all. He was a very affectionate dog. He loved to cuddle up in a big chair with me, taking up most of the space. He was my co-pilot who sat on the passenger seat from the time he was a pup, the better to be close. Duke and Gweni were always together in the dining room window, watching as I drove down the driveway, the two of them barking.

It is with heavy hearts and buckets of tears that we had to say goodbye to our Duke. He was the first Corgi I picked from the litter, the only little boy of the litter, the cuddler of the litter. He was my little guy.

We got Gweni and Duke together in April 2002. They were best buddies. They chased each other around and around the outside of the house, until she would turn and tumble him on his back. He was good natured and loved to play with his sister. They shared their lives, their plates, their yard, and the house. Duke loved a good bubble bath. He loved to nap in the big chair or wrapped up next to the fireplace in the winter. He loved to go for a swim in the lake or a creek in the summer.



Duke went to fewer training classes and private lessons than Gweni, and did agility for me. He earned his Open and Excellent titles and my first QQ in 8 years of trialing.

Duke was a gentle soul, who tolerated his outspoken, pushy, busy sibling. They never had a fight in all the years they were together, and as they aged, they seemed to get even more bonded. Over the last year, we noticed Duke's hearing seemed to fade every month. He was healthy except for a lipoma and some dental issues. Up to last fall, he even played with a tennis ball. We noticed his sight was also going. I watched him one morning carefully coming down the carpeted stairs only to misstep and tumble down the last few. So we carried Duke up and down stairs after that. Last month his breathing became labored, then just before Christmas, he suffered a seizure, which I happened to witness. It was awful. I watched as he came out of it, got up and stumbled around, bumping into corners in the bedroom. He was struggling.

So, the day after Christmas we made the heart wrenching call to help him pass. It was a day I dreaded for the last year as they began to show their age. Duke has left a hole in our hearts and we miss him terribly. We were lucky to share many years with him and Gweni. It's the end of an era. Duke was just 2 months shy of his 16<sup>th</sup> birthday. His sister Gweni seems to know and keeps walking around the house looking for him. After all, they lived their whole lives together, and now her best friend and brother is gone.
